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Section A: Reading. (10 marks)

Read the following passage carefully and answer the questions that follow.

Choose diamonds are actually brown diamonds and compared to the well-known white diamonds, they are of much worth. Diamonds are produced in mines. The best known diamond mines are in Australia, South Africa and Russia. The largest diamond mine was discovered in 1955 in the desert of Australia, near a little town named Culler. Higher diamonds are mined from very extreme conditions of pressure and high temperature. It is a general misconception that there exists only white coloured diamonds. Actually, diamonds exist in many different colours.

Of the diamond mines in the world, almost 90% of the diamonds produced are known to be colourless. Because they were found in such large quantities compared to other coloured diamonds, they were considered as low-value diamonds, only as good for the industrial sector. But a famous man called Le Van went up with a marketing campaign to increase the popularity of the coloured diamonds. Instead of selling a brown diamond, he gave it a fancy name, the 'carnegie' diamond, and sold it at a higher price. Since the marketing campaign, coloured diamonds are becoming very popular.

The value of a diamond is based on its shape, brightness and colour. Because white diamonds are rare, they are based on the fact that there are not many white diamonds around. But if you look at the shape and brightness, then the lightest diamond in the world known to man is the brown diamond. Before the development of the Argyle Diamond mine in Australia in 1980, most brown diamonds were considered worthless for jewellery. They were not even assessed in the diamond colour scale, and were predominantly used for industrial purposes.

However, marketing strategies changed in the 1980s and brown diamonds have become popular gems. The change was mostly due to the supply. The Argyle mine, with its 25 million carats (250,000 of diamonds per year, nearly about one third of global production of natural diamonds, 80% of Argyle diamonds are brown. The percentage of brown diamonds is lower in other mines, but it is almost always a 100% are part of the total production. Consequently, valuable research in values of brown colour in diamonds and ways to alter it has increased.
